You may notice that this issue of the Semaphore is a bit thin. Don't think that means nothing is going on, quite the opposite is true! Volunteers are busily working on a variety of high priority projects. Last month, some of you may have noticed the note regarding the Board settings deadlines for the passenger set. Plans are in the work for operating the cars this Fall. That means that the coaches have to get prepared and moved to the siding... **All before August!** And don't forget, that the Museum is opening to the public on May 16. Are you ready?

In terms of the excursion set, volunteers continue to rehab the interior of Coach 1 (NYC 2567). Most of the lower paneling has been replaced, along with new sills and trim. It certainly looks sharp. Once that is completed, it will be time for a fresh coat of paint, followed by the re-installation of the seating. The other coaches are in mostly good order, needing cleaning, COTSing and a final install of the windows. The sewing shop is still open, and now more than two coaches have new upholstery installed. While this is going on, others have been working to clear additional area to the west of the LA&L to further extend the siding for the coaches. The extension from last year has been spiked down and more stone is soon to arrive.

If that doesn't sound busy enough, a few other projects (*Continued on page 3*)

have been ongoing as *well*. Speaking of which, the water treatment building is almost done, and our contractor should soon be here installing the treatment equipment. Finally water at the restoration building... I'll drink to that! But that's not all that is happening around the shop. RG&E 1941 has been progressing nicely, having been started and moved under its own power. Currently, it is undergoing mechanical tweaking including the governors, but should be completed in a month or two. LV 211 has also been brought to life for the season, and some work to free up pedestal liners are under way.

Oh, I almost forgot... May 16! Its only two weeks away as I write this. We'll be kicking the year off again with diesel trains. Special events include the third Sunday of June and July, Diesel Days on August 21-22; and we will round out the season with at about seven weeks of regular diesel operations. We had a second well-attended rules class on April 18, with one more to come May 9 at RIT. Contact Bob Achilles (bobachilles@aol.com) if you'd like to attend. It's the first step to learning about safe train operation on our railroad! Yes, this issue may be a little thin, but we've been busy as ever at the museum. I'd also note that part of the reason this is a "light" edition was to get the ballot out early so everyone can get their vote in on time. I'd like to thank everyone working on the projects I outlined above, as I'm writing this in a hurry, I can't possibly recall everyone who has been able to lend a hand. Know that your hard work is appreciated! As we draw close to the operating season, I ask that we all lend a hand in keeping the museum looking clean and orderly and hope to see you at Industry enjoying the spring!
