



2019 WINTERFEST AT NYMT

More than a dozen trolley museums comprise the North East Association of Trolley Organizations (NEATO), and their annual “Winterfest” event was hosted by New York Museum of Transportation on February 16. Guest operators enjoyed their chance to ride and operate cars 161 and 168, two former Philadelphia & Western “Strafford” cars. Your museum was invited to operate a diesel shuttle between Midway and the Restoration Shop so visitors could tour our facilities and see our progress on restoring Rochester Subway Car 60.

Volunteers Rand Warner, Peter Gores, and John Redden have helped complete several cosmetic upgrades to help our visitors better understand our restoration goals. Improvements include a temporary dash made of masonite on which the restored headlight and a cleaned-up electric m.u. connector were attached. The front destination sign was installed and lit up as well. A temporary air line was connected to allow visitors to blow the whistle. The trolley gong has also been repaired, and two seats were temporarily installed. A table was placed at the rear of the car to hold our flat-

screen TV playing the documentary “The End of the Line” while the walls contained various historic exhibits pertaining to the Subway and Car 60.

We operated a total of four round trips serving more than 75 visitors, thanks to our volunteer train crew consisting of engineer Jerry Tusch, conductor David Kehrer, and car hosts Ray Howard, Chris Playford, and Dave Shields. We provided complimentary refreshments including sandwiches, chips, soda, and hot coffee for our visitors inside the Restoration Shop.

Of course, Car 60 was the star of the show, and we received many compliments on our progress, and very good advice on how to proceed with the restoration. Thanks also to project manager Charlie Marks who answered questions about BR&P 280, volunteers Joe Steimer and Bill Bachmann for hosting visitors in LV 95100, project manager Joel Shaw for showing off BNY 12, and volunteers Joe Nugent and Dave Scheiderich for giving tours of RG&E 8 and LA&L 20. As a result, your museum made valuable networking contacts in the world of railway preservation that we intend to build upon.

On April 27, we will be hosting our own meeting of railroad museums and historical societies. Stay tuned for details.

 ANNUAL RULES CLASS**

Safety Rules are required for ALL museum volunteers, while Operating and Air Brakes are required for all train crew volunteers. The class is split into three parts:

PART ONE: SAFETY – Strongly suggested for ALL VOLUNTEERS, regardless if you are in train service or not. Covers basic safety rules, radio rules, and customer service.

PART TWO: OPERATING – The second part of the class is devoted to rules of train operation. This second part is required for anyone interested in volunteering for train service as a brakeman, conductor, or engineer.

PART THREE: AIR BRAKES – The third part of the class is devoted to air brakes and train handling. This third part is




