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Some new developments! At our last meeting with the NYMT we were asked when we could begin test runs of diesel trains to the boarding area. These test runs will be happening soon, and if successful, will allow us to have another means of conveying our visitors for special events, when trolleys need some rest, or running with the trolleys for added capacity in the future. You can bet that the newly reactivated RG&E 1941 is a big part of those plans.

At our last board meeting Dave Shields presented a business plan for running the ESE coaches, although there is more discussion to had, it was an excellent presentation and a fine start to how we should conduct our affairs as we move forward.

I asked Jesse Marks to stay on as our publicity committee chairman, and the

board has confirmed his nomination. We look forward to his continued help.

Otto Vondrak and Bob Achillies will be working with NYMT on forming a joint policy on private groups using our location for filming or photo shoots. This is a service we have offered infrequently in the past, however our increased popularity has lead to more inquiries. The new policy will help us determine how to handle issues of compensation for our time and liability.

John Stewart is leading a project to start selling Richard Barrett's book titles once again, using electronic publishing and print on demand distribution. We are also working with author Ted Jackson on producing his Erie Railroad Rochester Division book in the same manner. More to come!

After a few months of working and planning on this, we are pleased to announce Pioneer Millworks has donated a generous amount

of Heart Pine to the Museum. Pioneer specializes in reclaiming old timbers from buildings, and such, then turning them into usable stock for new projects. This material is of domestic, old growth lumber. Typical of what was used in the original construction of rail equipment of days gone by. Jered tells us this particular type

of wood was mostly harvested in the 1890s. Couple that with the fact these trees typically were in the neighborhood of 150 to 200 years old at harvest, these trees were likely saplings in the late 1600s or early 1700s! A big thanks to Pioneer Millworks, Jered, and everyone involved.




