Only a few years ago, a country depot sat abandoned along an Erie branch line. 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
MOTIVE POWER DEPT.

PRIVATE MEMORIAL TRIP


Your museum made available two coaches and the RPO power car to the Livonia, Avon & Lakeville Railroad so they could

uation from Columbia after his service in World War II. He moved to Rochester in 1957 to become a law partner, and in 1965

became the founding counsel and board secretary for the Livonia, Avon & Lakeville Railroad. He passed away on August 26, 2011.

Due to the private nature of the trip, it was not announced to the public. The LA&L operated a special trip over the "original" line from Lakeville to Avon for close friends and family of Wise. Bob

Mader, Jim Johnson, Dick Holbert, and David Shields provided technical support on board the train, riding the RPO power car and keeping an eye on the generator and other important systems. LA&L president Gene Blabey asked that Dave Shields wear his passenger conductor's uniform and help greet guests. Duncan Richards was commissioned by the railroad to be the

PUBLIC RARE-MILEAGE TRIP SATURDAY, OCTOBER 27

As you may have heard, your museum is operating a special rare-mileage passenger excursion over the length of the LA&L from Lakeville to Mortimer Jct. (Henrietta) on **Saturday, October 27**. This will be the first public excursion using our coaches in many years, and also one of the first public excursions on the LA&L since they quit the passenger business in 1977. The train will consist of two of our ex-New York Central stainless steel coaches, and

the RPO/power car pulled by two Alco diesel locomotives provided by the LA&L. The trip is being operated as a fundraiser for the museum, with all ticket proceeds going towards supporting our opertions and restoration activities. Cost per ticket is **\$99.00** for the general public, **\$75.00** for museum members (in honor of our 75th anniversary as an organization). Cost of ticket includes a box lunch, a special illustrated route guide, and some other special perks to be announced later. OPERATIONS TRAINING

LEHIGH VALLEY CABOOSE

Restoration work has resumed on our Lehigh Valley caboose. A while ago we removed the ice box from the interior so we could address the effects of built-up condensation on the body. Volunteer Rob Burz has begin repairs to reinforce the bottom of the ice box so it can be reinstalled. Volunteer Joe Nugent has continued to remove the remainder of the wooden trim inside so we can finish paint stripping and evaluating the interior for repairs. We plan on plugging the windows with plywood so that we can heat

the car and continue work inside the shop through the winter. We will need to finish paint stripping, sand surfaces, and make to wooden interior ready for priming. We will also make any neededmetal repairs to the exterior body. Our goal is to have the body ready to sandblast and prime for painting this spring or summer. 


