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

The April Museum Membership Meeting was called to order at the 40&8 Club on University Avenue at 7:32 p.m. by Trustee Otto Vondrak in the absence of President Mike Dow.

Museum Library Report: The library move has been completed and the new Chairman of the Library Committee of this venture is Jim Ziobro. Jim has arranged some meetings with local library professionals to help us make some important decisions regarding cataloging some materials and finding new homes for others. We continue to solicit input on the direction that the membership wants to go in and see for the future.

Operations/Preservation: Otto Vondrak announced that May 11 would be our opening day, to coordinate with Amtrak's National Train Day weekend. SURVEYING THE FILL

On May 10, two students from Rochester Institute of Technology surveyed the fill south of the Restoration Shop. Elliot Courtney (2017) and David Stavans (2016) are both Civil Engineering students of RIT as well as members of RGVRRM. This was a great opportunity for them to put to use the skills learned in their classes. The equipment used was lent by the civil engineering department and professor Teresa Wolcott for this project. The surveying was done to know the elevation of the fill so earthwork could proceed for eventual track laying. This was an essential first step as we expand our storage capacity in the shop area. Both students will continue the next steps of the process for future material compaction and leveling for drainage on the fill.

LIBRARY UPDATE

On April 24, the Library Committee met with some local professional archivists and librarians to help us plot a course for the future of our library collection. One of the



goals is to retain the materials that have the most relevant historic value to our region, in accordance with our mission and collection management policies. As we look to enlist the help of professionals to catalog and preserve the collection, the committee recommended and the board of trustees accepted to remove the bulk of the entertainment items. This includes hobby and enthusiast publications as well as all VHS tapes and DVD's. While they have great entertainment value, they are of low research value, and are widely available from other sources. Removal of these

items will make the task of cataloging much easier. These materials will be made available to our members first, with the proceeds helping to preserve the remainder of the collection. We will make an announcement about upcoming work sessions in future editions of The Semaphore.

RIDGELY TOWER PARTS

You never know when opportunity will present itself. Last month I was on Facebook and saw a post from a friend out in Missouri looking for a good home for a

"locking bed" from the retired Ridgely Tower in Springfield, Illinois. Ridgely Tower was built by the Chicago & Alton Railroad; it controlled the crossing for the Chicago & Alton (now Union Pacific) and the Chicago & Illinois Midland (now Illinois Midland, part of Genesee & Wyoming). Ridgely was home to a 32 lever Saxby & Farmer lever frame, connected to the interlocking using pipeline and cranks. When the tower was closed in June 2010, it was the last remaining mechanically controlled interlocking in America. The parts were salvaged for later use and preservation. (Continued...)

In order to acquire these rare interlocking machine parts, we traded a few surplus signal parts we wouldn't need. We also ended up getting more interlocking machine parts donated to us in addition to the bed we traded for. These parts will allow us to make our own interlocking set up with having to alter the machine we salvaged from Niobe Tower in Pennsylvania so many years ago. I am currently building and designing a display of signals and interlocking machines inside our former Pennsylvania Railroad RPO car. Our hope is to create some new interactive displays that highlight signal technology past and present. Watch for updates in future editions of this newsletter.


