INSPECTION PIT PROGRESS

In December, the forms, rebar and rail on either side of the pit were in place and ready to pour the concrete base, but then winter set in. I had stayed optimistic that we would get enough of a thaw in late December or in January to pour the concrete, but that obviously did not happen.



So we have had to wave the white flag to Mother Nature and put the project on hold. Since all preparations are in place, as soon as the frost is out of the Restoration Shop we will be pouring concrete. We have enough funds to pour concrete for the rail base, around the pit and part of the East wall. As soon as the weather breaks and we complete the next pour, we will be putting on a full court press to raise the remaining money needed to finish the east wall and center section of concrete floor.

JOINT BOARD MEETING SUMMARY

Your board met with NYMT officers on February 4 to discuss a number of matters important to our continued success and growth. What follows is a summary of the agenda highlights.

The first item of business related to an amendment to NYMT's by-laws that specifically prevents any member of RGV from holding positions simultaneously on both boards, citing a potential "conflict of interest." Charlie Lowe reported there is a proposal on the table to rescind this amendment entirely.

Charlie Lowe made a presentation regarding the position of Chief Track Car Operator to supervise all track car operations throughout the year. Both boards nominated Jim Otto for the position, which he accepted. Both boards will vote separately to confirm the nomination.

Otto Vondrak made a presentation regarding the creation of a "Season Pass" that individuals could purchase during the joint operating season to take advantage of multiple visits at a discount. The pass would be good for admission and train rides to both museums, and would be counted as revenue evenly between both groups, but would not convey membership privileges. Discussion was tabled pending a review by the NYMT board.



Mike Dow explained that a new NORAC-based rulebook would be in effect starting with the 2015 joint operating season. The new rulebook would not significantly change operations, but would address a number of safety issues and other inconsistencies in the current rulebook. The final document is being prepared and NYMT will have opportunity to review before it is published. The NYMT board expressed their displeasure at not being involved in all aspects of planning and implementation of the new rulebook.

Charlie Lowe made a presentation on the Town of Rush's plans to open the former BOCES property adjacent to NYMT as a town park, complete with a system of recreational trails leading down to the river. Lowe asked for RGV assistance with a number of housekeeping projects related to this development, to which RGV enthu-

siastically agreed.

Otto Vondrak made a presentation regarding the 2015 joint operating schedule. The schedule is altered slightly from last year, opening to the public on June 7, and running until November 1. Both boards unanimously approved the new joint operating schedule.

Otto Vondrak made a presentation regarding an increase in the joint advertising budget that would allow both organizations to promote the entire joint operating season. The discussion was tabled pending review by the NYMT board.

Mike Dow called for a committee to be formed to develop joint holiday operations, based on our success with Halloween and Santa Trains. Dave Coon and Mark Wilczek nominated themselves, both boards will seek one additional member each to serve on the committee.

Mike Dow called for a committee to be formed to address joint track projects and investments. Charlie Lowe nominated himself and Rich Fischpera, Dow nominated Bob Achilles (recently appointed RGV Track and ROW Supt.).

Mike Dow offered RGV assistance in reviewing and improving the museum displays at NYMT. Charlie Lowe deferred discussion to Jim Dierks.

Mike Dow expressed RGV's concern over equal coverage by the press during the joint operations season when members of the media show up unannounced at NYMT. Otto Vondrak offered to draft a procedure to help NYMT's Officer of the Day and RGV Depot Guides deal with "surprise" visits by the media, to be reviewed by Jim Dierks.

Mike Dow and Jim Dierks have been working in committee to identify ways to streamline and improve operations at the NYMT ticket desk. Dow distributed copies of the preliminary report, but tabled the discussion in the interest of time.

Mark Wilczek made a presentation regarding the efficiency and costs of operating the weekday private group tours. Wilczek has been working with Jim Dierks, and asked for his committee to be officially sanctioned by both boards so his work can continue. Both boards agreed. Presently, RGV is not participating in group tours, pending the outcome of the committee findings.

The date for the next joint board meeting was set for June 6, with the stipulation that another meeting could be scheduled sooner if there are matters to discuss prior to the opening of the joint operating season.

This class is required for anyone operating on our shared railroad at any time for any reason (whether for the public or not). This year, we STRONGLY ENCOURAGE ALL VOLUNTEERS to attend the first part of rules class which is related to your personal safety around the railroad.

Class will start with mandatory Safety Training for all volunteers. For those interested in being a conductor or engineer, the required Air Brake & Train Handling class will follow after the Book of Rules Class. Coffee and donuts will be available in the morning; and we will "pass the hat" and order some pizza for lunch.

These classes are open to anyone, and are a pre-requisite for future hands-on training. If you think there's a remote chance you want to get your hands dirty this year, you must attend the full class. Can't attend March 14? We will schedule additional classes as make-ups.


