

# ROCHESTER & GENESEE VALLEY MUSEUM WORK PROGRESS REPORT

#### General

- Spring is just around the corner and all activities are picking up at our Museum. Come on out and take a look at what's happening, either at the Depot or up at Sodus.
- Track work has already resumed, pushing north (in fact, it never really stopped). Ice storm damage from fallen trees has been cleared. Construction equipment and Maintenance of Way equipment is being readied for heavy use. We're getting quotations from contractors for excavation and concrete work on our high priority list. Signal and telephone communication systems are being extended and will be put to good use this year as we get into operations. Additional wiring is going into the Depot and underground power distribution system. Drainage along the R.O.W. and around the Depot and yards is being improved. Motive Power is being reviewed, inspected and refurbished as necessary for the coming season. The big push is on to put H.E.P. (Head End Power) wiring into our excursion fleet for our coming passenger season on the OMID. Siding work and painting work is being reviewed for our freight cars.
- Publicity and outreach efforts are underway now to promote and to help assist us in our 1991 season activities. We may be getting volunteers from a Senior Citizens group. With the Persian Gulf conflict under control, we may be hearing from our good friends, the Naval Reserve Sea Bees again. Several of them were sent to the Persian Gulf.

#### **MOTIVE POWER**

-Supt. John Redden

Harold Crouch, Jeff Bochman, Rand Warner and John Redden traveled to New Jersey to inspect various types of diesel electric motive power for possible acquisition for our chapter fleet. Larry Batler has constructed a gasoline powered pre-lube

pump for diesel locomotive use that can be used anywhere without regard to weather or power availability. Dick Holbert has removed and disabled the pesky manual override shut-down switch/circuitry on EK loco \*6. Plans are being made for repainting NKP \*79 this year when weather improves, by John Redden and Rick Ashmead. Dick Holbert and Jim Johnson have started plans and tune up for work on LV \*211. Will be putting water in NKP \*79 and LV \*211, soon as frost is past, so that we can get into our Spring Startup.

Arrangements are being made for a qualified technical inspection of EK #6 loco. This loco has been the mainstay of our fleet for the past 10 years now and we are really coming to depend on it. A thorough inspection by a qualified consultant is in order.

We will be firing up NKP #79 and LV #211 as soon as weather permits and batteries are ready. Paint, trim & decal/lettering work will be finished on LV #211 and arrangements will be scheduled for paint work on NKP #79.

Various options to power our MU car for operation on 250 volts DC prior to catenary availability are being investigated.

We will be continuing to review options and opportunities for possible acquisition of relevant diesel, steam and electric motive power to selectively enhance our Museum's offering to the visiting public.

Looking downstream, we will be planning to operate locomotive hauled passenger trains from our Rochester & Genesee Valley Railroad Museum to the New York Museum of Transportation, probably beginning in 1992. We hope to have end-to-end speeder rides between the two Museums before the end of 1991.

Long range, we need to establish a servicing facility with turntable, shop, drop pit, sand and water towers, and possibly a round house. An indoor shop facility would greatly enhance restoration and repair of both our railroad and non-railroad equipment.
