
PROGRAM NOTES

Looking Back on the 1991 Year

It certainly has been a bang-up year, thanks to our volunteers, support from our Board of Trustees, and you our members. Outstanding accomplishments include:

- Over 1000 feet of track has been constructed and preparations have been made for the last 1000 feet.
- New concrete platforms and drains have been installed all around the Depot.
- RG&E 45 ton GE side rod diesel engine has been added to our motive power fleet.
- HEP wiring has been installed on our Chapter NYC coach and the rest of our excursion car fleet.
- Major collection of semaphore signal equipment (Erie RR) has been brought in from southern tier.
- 200 Amp wiring service to Depot and underground power distribution system has been completed.
- Bay City Shovel and Ford Industrial fork lift tractor have been added to construction equipment.
- Extensive refurbishment has been completed on Jackson Tamper and Chevy Hi Rail maintenance-of-way equipment.
- Depot/Museum facility was manned for Jun-Oct season plus assorted weekday tour groups.
- Extensive media publicity was achieved through television, newspapers and radio, plus 10,000 flyer brochures.

Looking Ahead to the 1992 Year

- Completion of track connection from NRHS to NYMT.
- Beginning use of operational block signal system.
- Operational use of all four diesel locomotives.
- Acquisition of box car(s) for storage capacity.

- Refurbishment of Erie Stillwell coach for open air ride service.
- FRA type inspections for all revenue service cars.
- Operational use of offices in north end of Depot.
- Freight and passenger train operation on our line.
- Acquire or operate a piece of steam powered equipment.
- Provide power source for operation of MU Power Car.
- Begin end-to-end/museum-to-museum operation of speeders.
- Establish design for expansion south of Rt. 251.
- Acquire land for current and future expansion.

TRACK & RIGHT-OF-WAY -Supt. - Bill Reid - 589-4388

All final ballasted track has been blocked and tamped. The 250 ties (10 bundles) delivered from A&K Railroad Supply by Morgan Grain Service have been laid on fresh ballast from General Crushed Stone. Rail from our CONRAIL salvage job at Caledonia has been final spiked and gaged and leveled ready for top ballasting, an addition of 500 feet of new track, which brings our track north to manhole #15. Final grading has been completed the rest of the way north to the old NYMT end of track. Stone to go under the next batch of ties has been put down on this section and is ready to be graded. Necessary fill has been added to the west side of right-of-way and ditching is proceeding on the east side of right of way. Additional grading has been accomplished south of switch #6 on top of the hill, to permit construction of badly needed yard storage tracks. Switch #6 has been extended south as the yard lead. All turnouts have been inspected and frogs are being repaired as needed. Thanks to Jeff Baxter, Dave MonteVerde, Bill Reid, Rand Warner, Larry Fennessy, John Redden, Joe Scanlon, Jeff Carpenter, Charlie Harshbarger, Jeff Bochman, Jim Johnson, Neil Bellenger, Dave Luca, Bob Miner, Mike Dow, Norm Shaddick, and Dick Holbert. Chapter and private equipment used included Euclid Loader, Bay City Shovel, Huber Wabco Grader, international Dump Truck, Ford Boom Truck, Ford Tractor Loader, Rand Air Compressor, Balmar Backhoe, EK#6 Loco, Chevy Hi Rail, Jackson Tamper, LVRR pushcar.

Our future plans include:

Extend the culverts as necessary in vicinity of Manhole #15. Complete grading of ballast to go under next batch of ties. Bring in another tractor trailer load of ties from Manchester. Complete ditching of east side of right of way north and south of Manhole #15. Lay out curves for rework of NYMT trackage to meet NRHS trackage. Repair turnout frogs as necessary for safety and reliability of train, hi rail and speeder operations. Weather permitting, extend final grading north to new connection point for NRHS and NYMT trackage. Investigate additional sources of rail, plates, ties and switch timbers to complete northward track construction in 1992.

CONSTRUCTION EQUIPMENT

-Supt. - Joe Scanlon - 865-7668

Progress made during the last three months include:

- Euclid loader brakes have been fixed and transmission checked by Bernie Doran. He has also restrung cables for Gradall boom so we now have two critical pieces of equipment back in operation. Last month Bernie fixed the steering on the Ford forklift and right now he's working on the pinion assembly for the RG&E locomotive.
- Larry Betler has fabricated new pins and bushings for the bucket linkage on our backhoe tractor which was severely worn.
- Hydraulic hoses have been replaced on Euclid loader and Balmar backhoe by Rand Warner.
- Running maintenance and lubrication for all machines has been provided by Charlie Harshbarger, Dick Holbert, Norm Shaddick, Joe Scanlon and Rand Warner.
- Antifreeze protection has been checked by Joe Scanlon and Rand Warner.

Future plans include:

- Fix leaky control valve for horizontal swing on Balmar Backhoe bucket boom.
- Tighten engine mounts on Gradall ditcl and International dump truck.
- Check battery charging circuit and generator on Balmar backhoe.
- Refurbish out second jackhammer for use in power spiking rail to ties.
- Troubleshoot our Miller welder generator electrical system.
- Replace muffler and weak battery on Rand air compressor.
- Repair hood and front clip assembly on Ford boom truck.
- Check generator and battery charging circuit on Ford fork lift.

FREIGHT EQUIPMENT

-Supt. - Vacant

Our Erie Caboose "SWAT TEAM" consisting f Neil Bellenger, foreman, and assisted by Duncal Richards, Chris Hauf, Mark Poppalardo, Chuck Riedmiller and Jamie Riedmiller has been discussing interior and exterior restoration plans for this most often used piece of rolling stock. Locomotives, freight and passenger car spare parts and consumables are being consolidated and inventoried for ease of use.

Future plans include:

- Finalize plans for Erie Caboose #C-254.
- Work out arrangements for relocation of Pennsy hopper car onto our museum trackage.
- Refurbish and install kerosene caboose interior lantern donated by Ed VanHorn.
- Prepare all cabooses for use in conjunction with annual Year End Party.

OFF THE WIRE

Amtrak's "Executive Sleeper" Service between New York and Washington was named one of the "20 best rail rides in the world" by International Railway Traveler Magazine in its May/June 1991 issue. (Newsbreak, via Cinders)

Morrison-Knudsen in a letter dated August 3, told 164 employees of its Mountain Top, PA, plant about its plans to close the facility. M-K plans to retain 12-15 workers at the plant as part of a maintenance staff. M-K hopes the closing of the plant will only be temporary. In 1989, M-K paid \$1.7 million for the former Foster-Wheeler plant on 102 acres in Mountain Top. (Southern Tier Rail Fanning)

Norfolk Southern is reported to have retired all former Nickel Plate Road GP30's (NS 2900-2909, ex-NKP 900-909). One and only former NKP GP35 (NS2910, ex-NKP 910) has been stored out of service, along with former Wabash GP35's 2914 and 2918; the latter unit has been donated to National Museum of Transport at St. Louis. (Danville Flyer via Lakeshore NRHS Timetable)

Office Car 10000 in for repairs. Office Car 10000, which has been leased by Amtrak from owner Bill Kratville for a number of years, is currently shopped in Oakland, CA for some repairs and improvements. The work is scheduled to be completed and the car returned to the East Coast later this year. (The Call Board)

Amtrak retired P30CH's nos. 700-704, 706, 708-710, 714, 718, 719 and 722-724 on August 19. The remainder of the GE fleet will continue to run on the Sunset Limited. (Narragansett Newsletter via Lake Shore NRHS Timetable)
