On June 12, we hosted our first Trains & Trolleys at Twilight in cooperation with NYMT, followed by Princess & Superhero Train Rides on June 19 and 20. July 10 is our second installment of Trains & Trolleys at Twilight, with Black Diamond Train Rides following on July 17 and 18. As always, having extra volunteers helps everything run smoother.

Meanwhile, we're wrapping up two caboose projects in the Restoration Shop. The multi-year restoration of Lehigh Valley 95100 is coming to a close as Charles Bell leads the effort to apply body filler, primer, and the finished coat of red in time to debut for our night photo event on Au-

gust 21. At the same time, Justin Carmona is wrapping up the repairs being made to Erie C254, which includes new glazing in reconditioned window frames. Next up for service will be our New York Central and Penn Central cabooses.

We are also gearing up for some major restoration projects in the coming months, and getting ready for our busy fall operating season. As always, we can use your help to help move us forward. Your museum needs help on train crews, in the restoration shop, on the track gang, in the gift shop, and even behind the scenes working from home. 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
UPCOMING MONTHLY PROGRAMS

MECHANICAL DEPT.

Former Livonia, Avon & Lakeville Alco RS-1 no. 20 was fired up for the first time this season on July 3, thanks to the efforts of Sam Rosenberg replacing a burst radiator hose. Look for this locomotive to make an appearance later this season.

Upon completion of repairs to the Erie caboose (thanks to Justin Carmona and his volunteer crew), it will be pulled from the shop and added to our regular train in place of the Penn Central transfer caboose, which will be set aside for repairs. But first, our New York Central caboose will be placed into the shop to have its brake valve replaced, and some other minor repairs to get it ready for service this fall.

Joe Nugent repaired the air line on Le-

high Valley RS-3m 211, so that it can be safely moved around the railroad for our photo event in August. The locomotive remains out of service for this season, however, while we address electrical issues.

On June 26, volunteers Joel Shaw, Peter Gores, Jeremy Tuke, Otto Vondrak, and Joe Nugent helped sort various parts for our Vulcan and Heisler steam locomotives. The parts for the Vulcan (otherwise known as Brooklyn Navy Yard no. 12) were set aside on pallets and brought into the shop as part of the next step in cosmetic restoration.

The restoration of Lehigh Valley 95100 is coming into the home stretch. By the



time you read this, the caboose should be wearing its first coat of primer and getting ready for the final coat of Cornell Red. Our goal is to have the caboose painted and lettered by the end of July. We are planning a special night photo session on August 21 that will involved the caboose, our LV boxcar, and LV 211. Thanks to Chuck Whalen, Joe Steimer, Charles Bell, Bernie Beikirch, Mark Charles, and Jon and Lisa Talty for their assistance in getting this project over the finish line and into the active fleet.

ERIE CABOOSE C254 UPDATE

Repairs are wrapping up with the new plywood panels for the wall in the southwest corner replaced at the end of May by Kiara Harris and Justin Carmona. All windows have been rebuilt and repainted, with new panes of safety glass installed, thanks to Charlie Marks. Otto Vondrak helped paint the plywood panels with fresh "battleship gray." The floor has gotten a fresh coat of paint as well. Thanks to Joe Nugent for plumbing the conductor's emergency brake valve and air gauge. Bill Marcotte replaced two missing ladder rungs torched off by Conrail, with an eye toward replacing the ladder hoops and steel walkways on the roof later this year.

By the time you read this, Erie C254 should be back in regular service. There's still some minor work to do here and there, but that can be worked on as time permits throughout the season. Thanks to everyone who contributed to this project.


